Cassis decided to start the winter market due to demand from a few of her vendors who regularly participate in the weekly market. The chamber offered up the location and the second Saturday each month was chosen because of how it aligned with the artist market already held just a few blocks away at the Purple Goose, 101 N. Main St.

"I wanted something central," Cassis said. "I know Halley (Jones) over at The Purple Goose is having second Saturday markets as well, so I thought with being at the Chamber building ... you jump across the street at you're at The Purple Goose.


