# VACT receives American Girl children's grant

For the second year in a row, Verona Area Community Theater has received a grant from the American Girl's Fund

The grant of \$8,100 will fund the upcoming Aristocats show for children grades 2-4 that will run from April 11-13, 2019.

The American Girl Fund For Children's grants has given VACT the fund-ing flexibility to add a 4th spring show to serve more children in the Dane County Area," Alyssa Dvorak, vice president of the VACT Board of Directors wrote in an email to the Press

VACT is among 33 organizations in the Madison area was awarded nearly \$500,000 in grant money for arts, cultural and environmental programs, according to a news release from the Fund for Children. Awards were announced in September.
